Student Rules and Regulations

PLEASE READ, INITIAL, SIGN AND DATE THIS FORM - - - - THANK YOU!

- A Liability/Indemnity Release Form must be signed by every student and/or parent/guardian
- Speed Limit is 5 mph or slower. This will be enforced! Safety is our number one priority so **SLOW DOWN!**
- Shockey Stables is a **TOBACCO FREE** facility, thank you for your cooperation.
- Please do not chew gum while riding, it is a potential safety hazard.
- No shorts, hiking boots or tennis shoes! Ladies: use head bands, pony tails, etc. to keep hair out of your face.
- Long pants, smooth soled boots or riding shoes required. Go to www.valleyvet.com to see riding shoes, (aka: Roper Horseshoes) or visit a local western store.
- Tack, grooming kit and horse must be put away after each session unless otherwise specified. Close each gate securely; double check for safety.
- **MANAGEMENT WILL ALWAYS NOTIFY PARENT/STUDENT UPON CANCELLATION OF THE CLASS**
- If you have not received a text, email or phone call canceling your class within **ONE** hour of your scheduled time be prepared to ride. ***Weather permitting; we ride year round including holidays.***
- If you can not attend, please email msjudy@shockeystables.com or call the office phone 325-690-0585 “**ASAP**” so your spot may possibly be filled that day. If you tell us you won’t be here “next week” you must follow up your notice with email or voicemail. Management most likely will not recall the verbal notice and you might possibly be charged with a ‘**NO-SHOW**’.
- If you fail to cancel before the start of your scheduled riding time be prepared to pay for both sessions on your next visit. Initial here for acknowledgement and agreement.
- Three (3) strikes and you are “**OUT!**” A ‘**NO-SHOW**’ for three times without prior notification and/or payment will be dropped from the program.
- It is the responsibility of each parent and/or student to arrive at your scheduled time. Tardiness is unfair to the other riders.
